    - 6.1.1. At November 2024 JAG Commission mtg we heard that people now get released

w 30 days of medication but then may have to wait months for an appiontment at

Emeline to fill a prescription. What is the process and can anything be done to help

support people getting prescriptions filled before they run out?

County Behavioral Health representative reported that there are same day and next day appointments at Emeline every day. Also available are bridge medication appts. This will also be repeated at February Commission meeting.

- 6.2. Administrative Separation
  - 6.2.1. Continued concerns expressed re women in Main Jail, H Unit with more significant behavioral health concerns being isolated for days, weeks, maybe months, and sometimes released from isolation. Psychological effects of solitary confinement discussed and laws dictating prisons use of solitary to be reviewed (even though they do not legally apply to jails).
  - 6.2.2. Last report from SCSO at November 2024 JAG Commission meeting was 6 women were in H Unit restricted to cell 23 hours a day. At the same meeting Chief Dan Freitas reported in his ppt presentation that there were no women in Administrative Separation. Follow up for clarification is planned.
  - 6.2.3. Discussion re inviting NAMI families and/or women who have experienced being in Administrative Separation sharing their experiences and perspectives.
