



U.S. 2020 Billion-Dollar Weather and Climate Disasters




This map denotes the approximate location for each of the 16 separate billion-dollar weather and climate disasters that impacted the United States from January–September 2020.










Mean Max Temperature - BEN LOMOND NO. 4, CA



Sign up for Reverse 9-1-1 Notifications - CodeRED

ACodeRED[™]

Santa Cruz Regional 9-1-1 uses the CodeRED community notification system to send important messages to residents, businesses, and visitors within Santa Cruz and San Benito Counties in the event of emergency situations or critical community alerts. CodeRED is capable of sending thousands of messages in a very short time based on geographic location of an incident to landlines, cell phones, emails, and their mobile app.

Examples of notifications can include:

Emergency evacuations (including wildfires and flooding)

Missing person alerts

Severe weather alerts

Emergency police activity

You can self-enroll in CodeRED and receive alerts based on your home or business address.

How to Self-Enroll

Click here to self-enroll today and stay informed! If you use a cell phone or VoIP for your voice calls, registering is extremely important. We are only able to get this information from YOU! If you have problems registering your telephone, you can reach CodeRED Technical Support at 866-939-0911.

Download the App

The CodeRED Mobile Alert app provides advanced, real-time, location-specific alerts designed to keep residents and visitors informed and safe as they travel across the United States and Canada. We can initiate notifications via phone, email, and/or text. Messages can include text and audio, as well as feature a map with the location of the warning area. The free mobile app is available on the App Store and Google Play.




Welcome Recent News

iNWS is an experimental service intended for NWS core partners: emergency managers, community leaders, other government agencies and the electronic media.














































Weak La Niña and California Precipitation


