

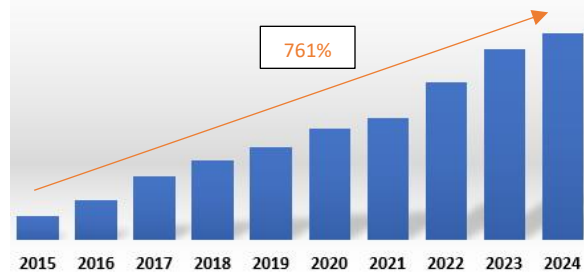
Pretrial Division At-A-Glance (2024)

The Pretrial system reduces reliance on incarceration without compromising public safety, protects the public, ensures the rights of individuals to *least restrictive* practices, and is based on fair and equitable pretrial decision-making.

Pretrial Services

- 2812 Public Safety Assessments (PSA) were completed to provide the court with release recommendations. Status reports are also submitted for subsequent court appearances.
- 1147 individuals were monitored in the community awaiting trial in 2024, with a Pretrial Average Daily Population (ADP) of 327 (up 9% from 2023).
 - 83% Male/17% Female
 - 6% African American; 46% Latinx; 43% White; 5% Other
 - Average age – 39 years old
- 580 individuals were placed on location monitoring equipment / 703 supervision cases.
- 629 individuals were placed on Supervised Own Recognizance (9% increase from 2023).

Pretrial Services in Action

Probation's Pretrial Services assisted an individual facing medical and mobility challenges. After being granted pre-arraignment release and securing a court date for the very next day. Pretrial staff coordinated bridge housing and transportation to the facility. On the day of the hearing, Pretrial staff transported the individual to court and stayed by their side until the case was resolved. This is one example of how Pretrial Services goes above and beyond to support a fair and effective pretrial system – reducing reliance on incarceration while maintaining public safety and upholding individuals' rights.

PSA & Concurrence Rate

Pretrial staff utilize the Public Safety Assessment-Court (PSA-Court) tool and a decision-making framework to inform judicial decision for release or detention pending case disposition.

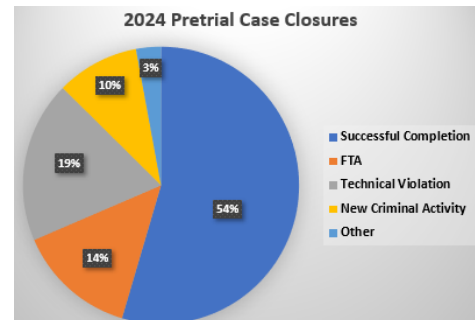
- 69% Public Safety Assessment (PSA) Recommendations were followed by Judicial Officers

Pre-Arraignment/Medical Releases: 7 Pre-Arraignment releases
6 Medical releases

Call Phone Project: 47 cell phones and 9-minute cards dispersed to support court reminders & telephone reporting

Outcomes and Success

- ✓ 90% Did not commit New Criminal Activity (NCA)
 - 68 misdemeanor case closures (7 violent)
 - 52 felony case closures (23 violent)
- ✓ 86% Appeared for Court / 14% Failed to Appear for Court
- ✓ 81% Did not have a Technical Violation
- ✓ 76% Successful Completion – Made all appearances, no new offenses (decreased 2% compared to 2023 rate)
