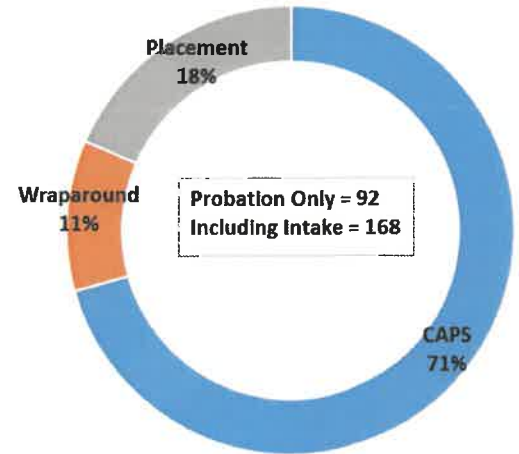

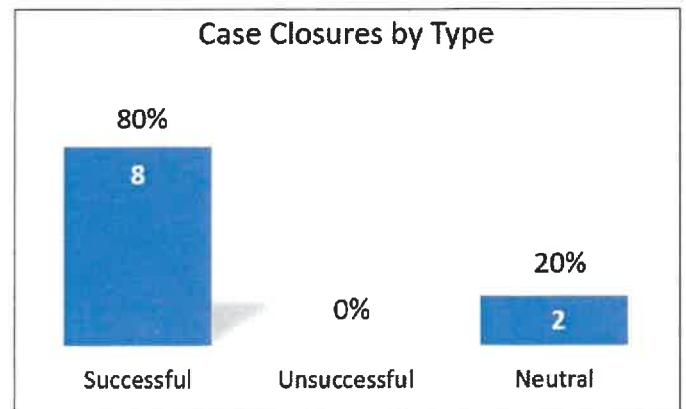
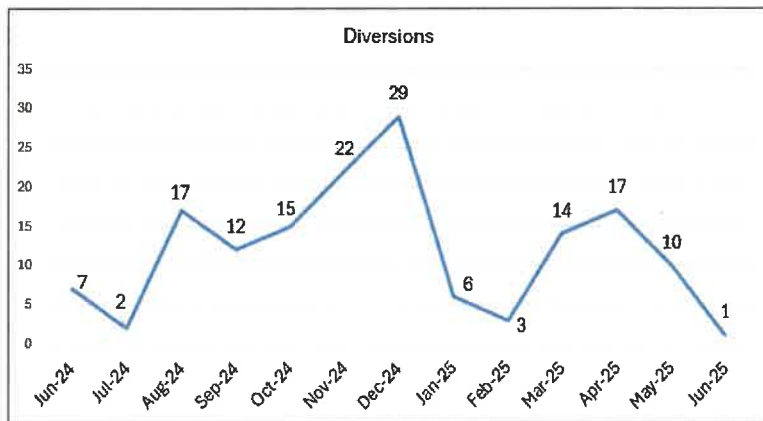

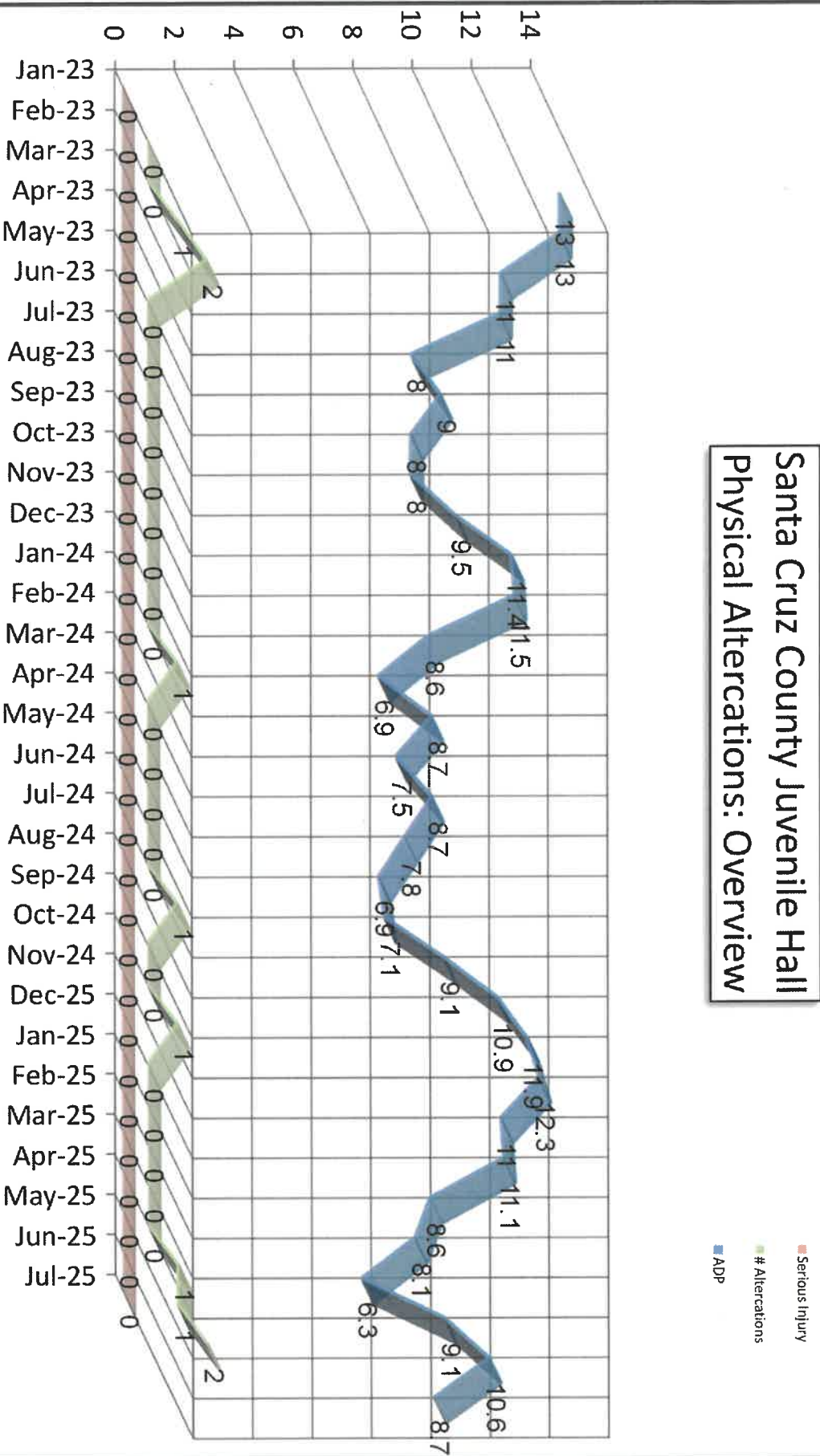

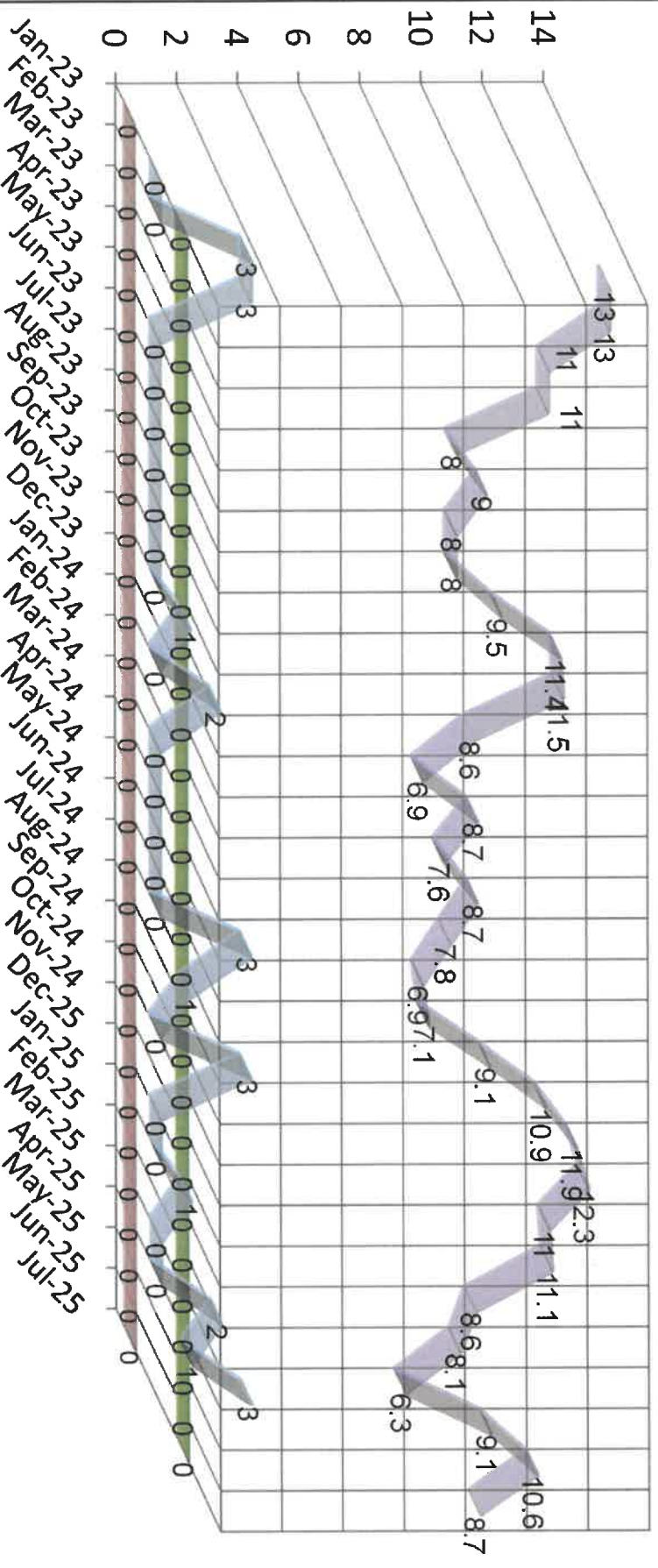
Santa Cruz County Juvenile Hall Physical Altercations: Overview

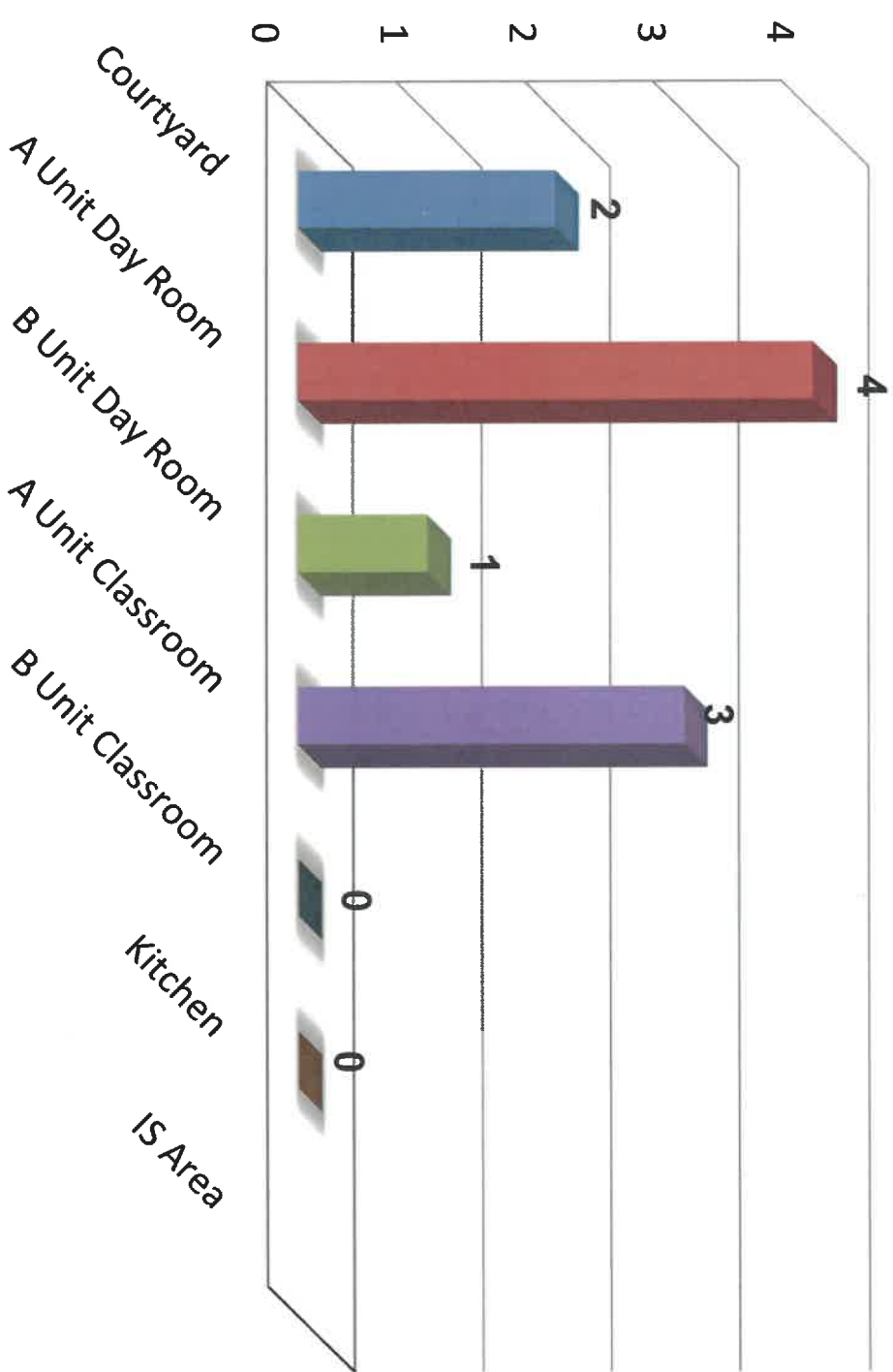
Use of Force: Overview

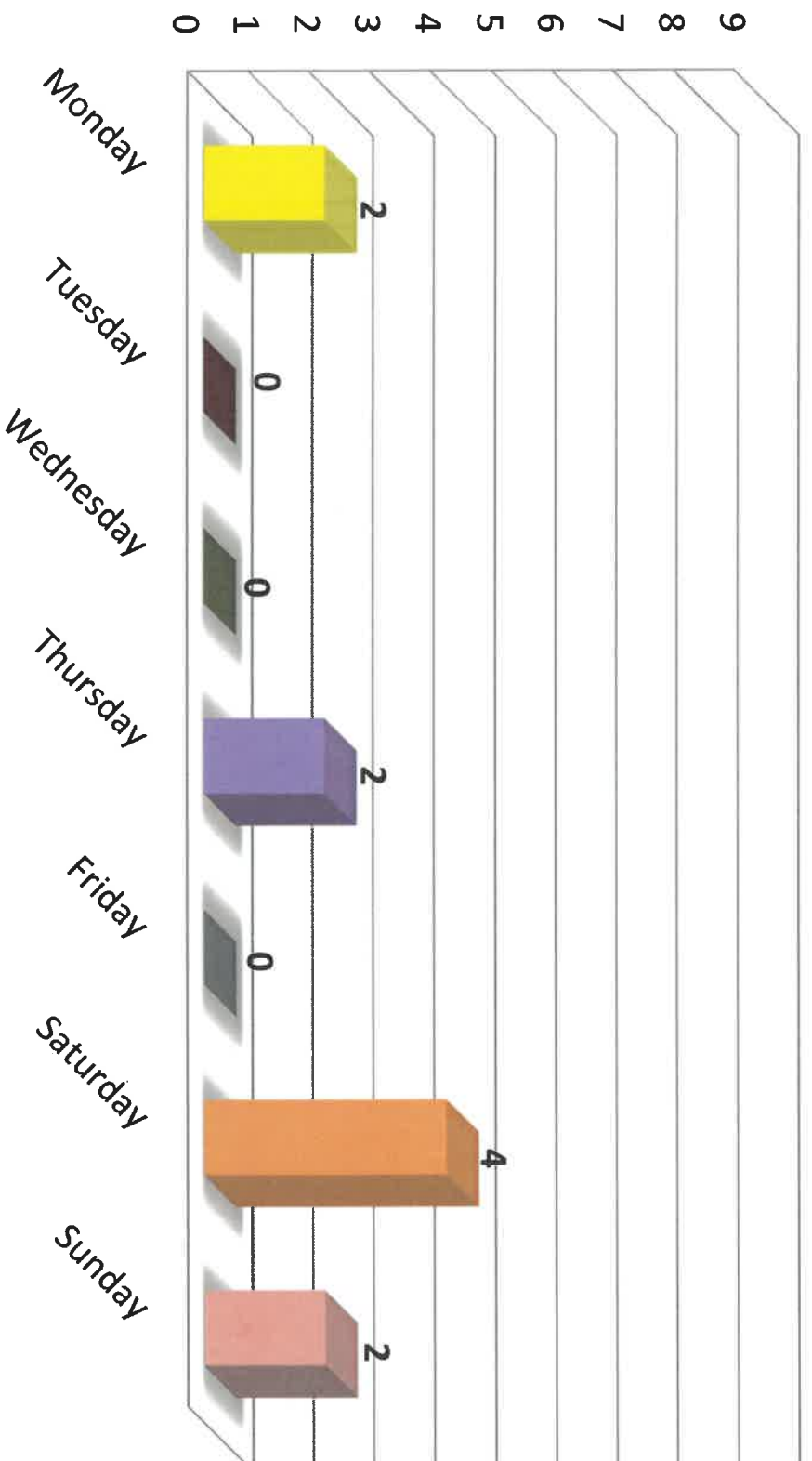

Santa Cruz County Juvenile Hall Physical Altercations: Location

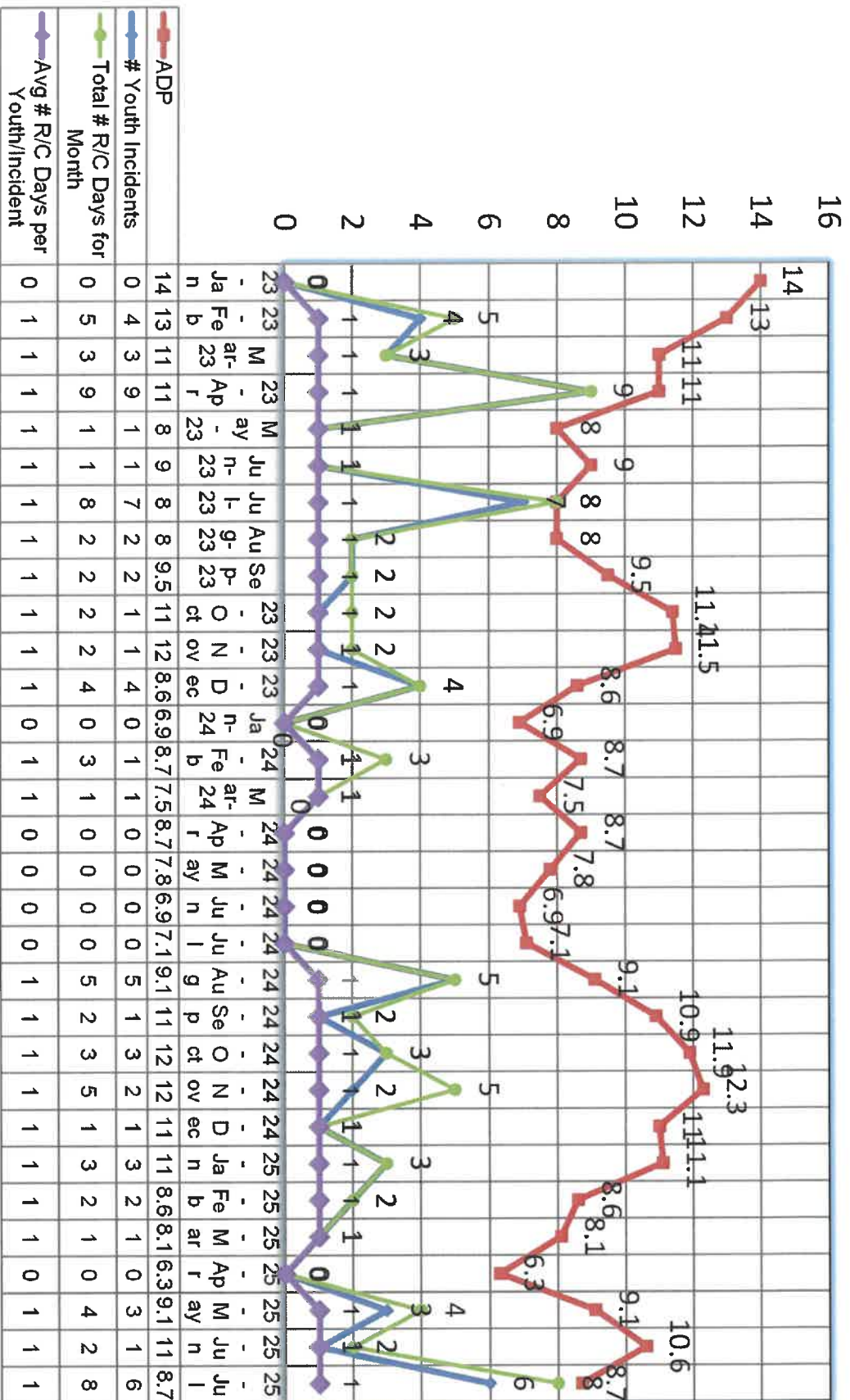

Physical Altercations: Day of the Week

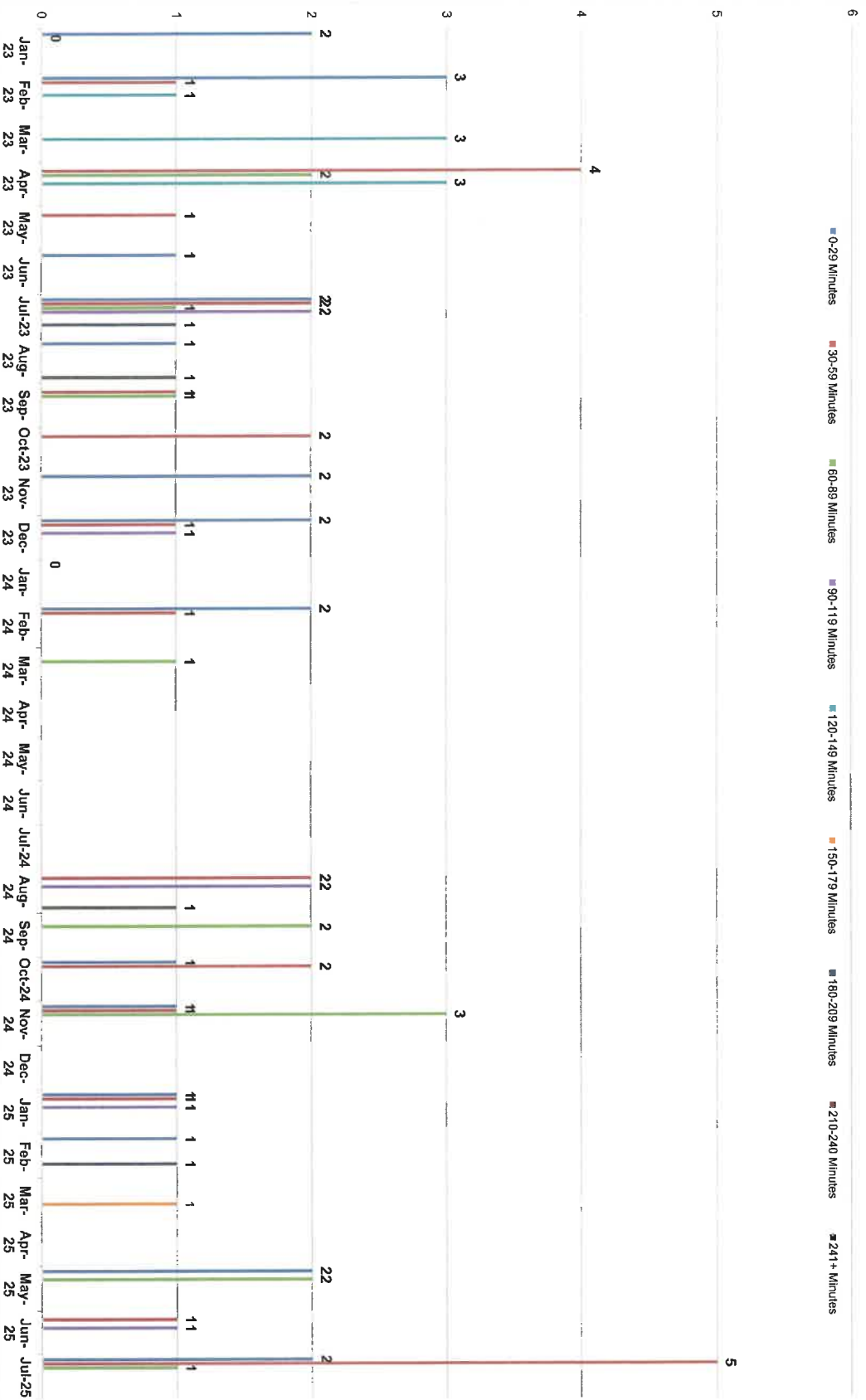

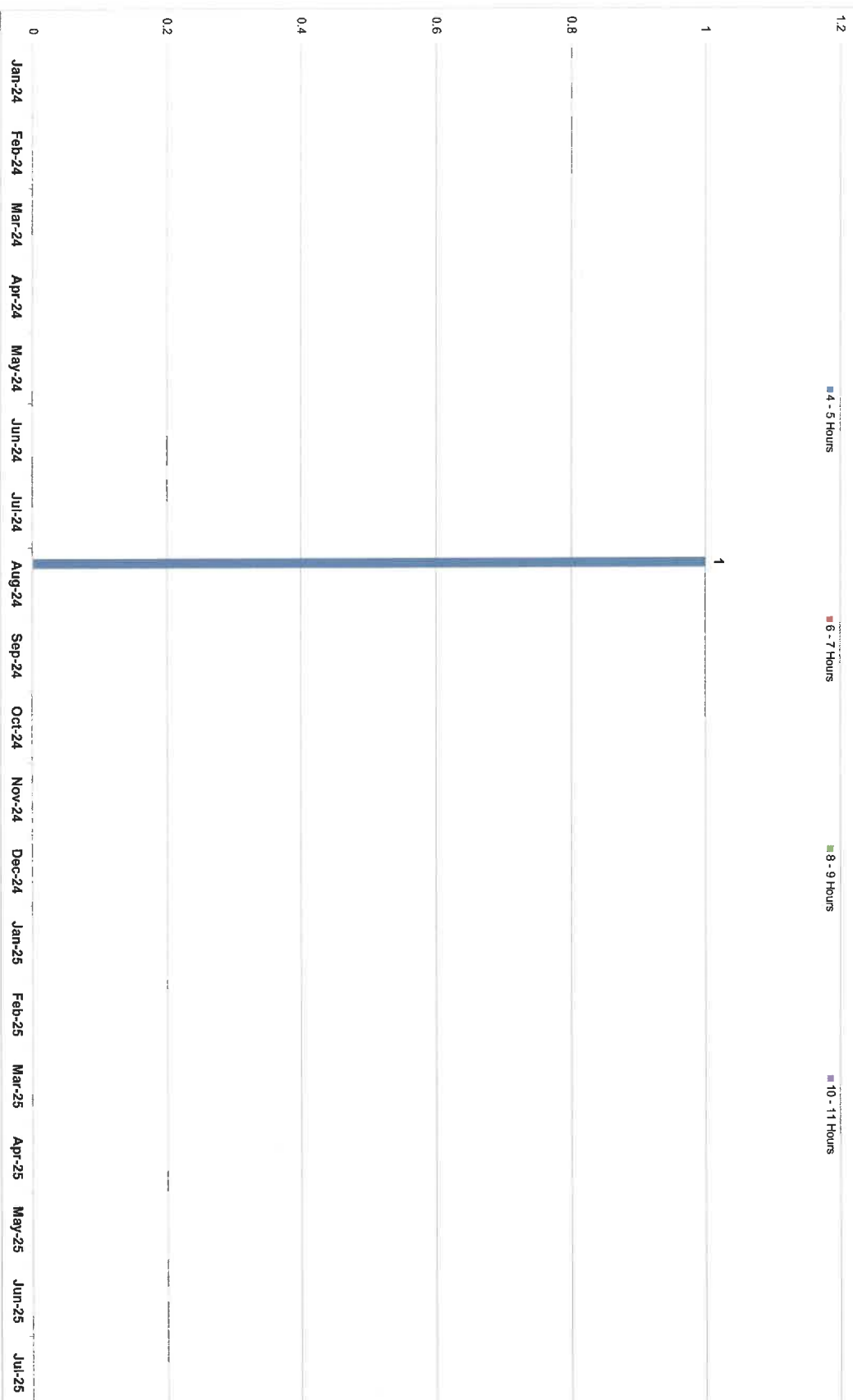

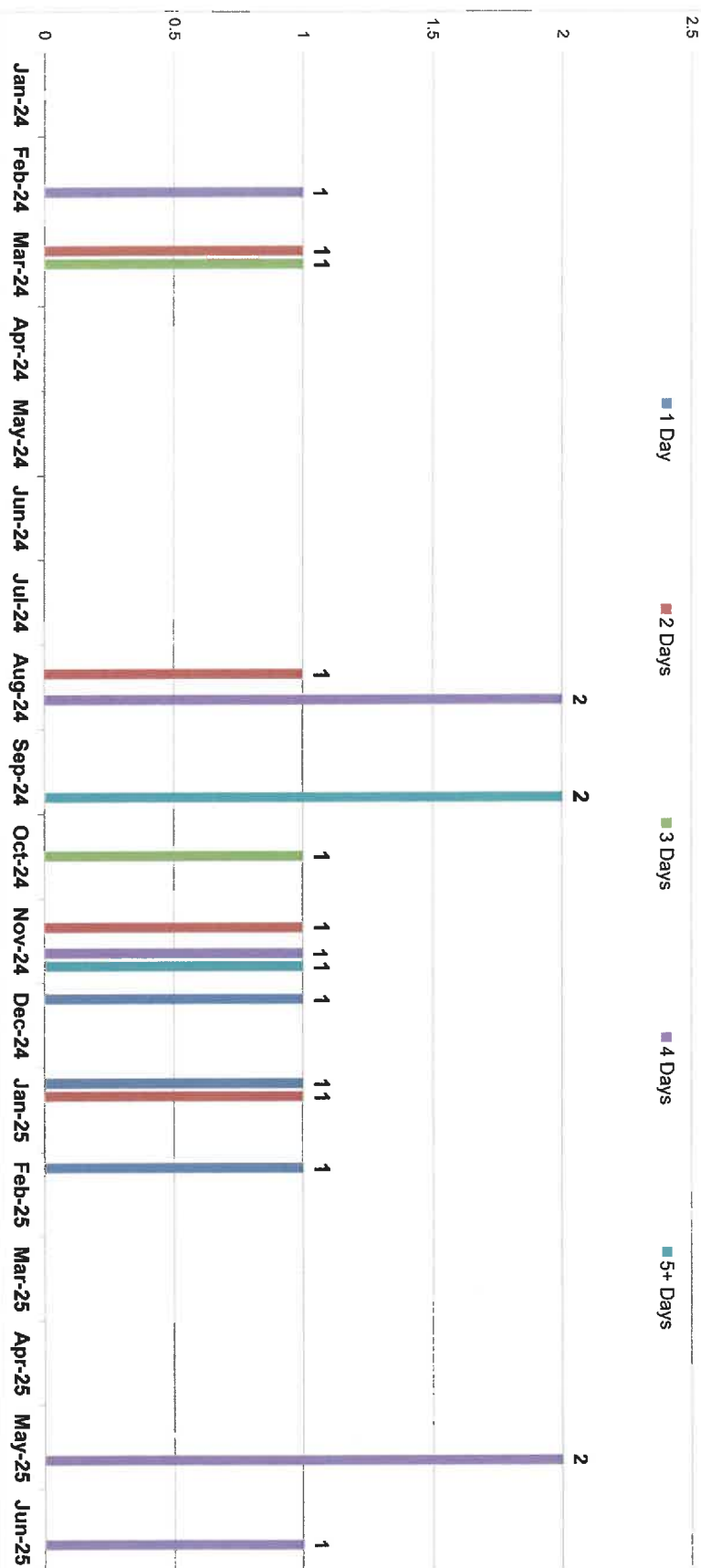
Santa Cruz County Juvenile Hall Room Confinement by Minute January 2023 - July 2025



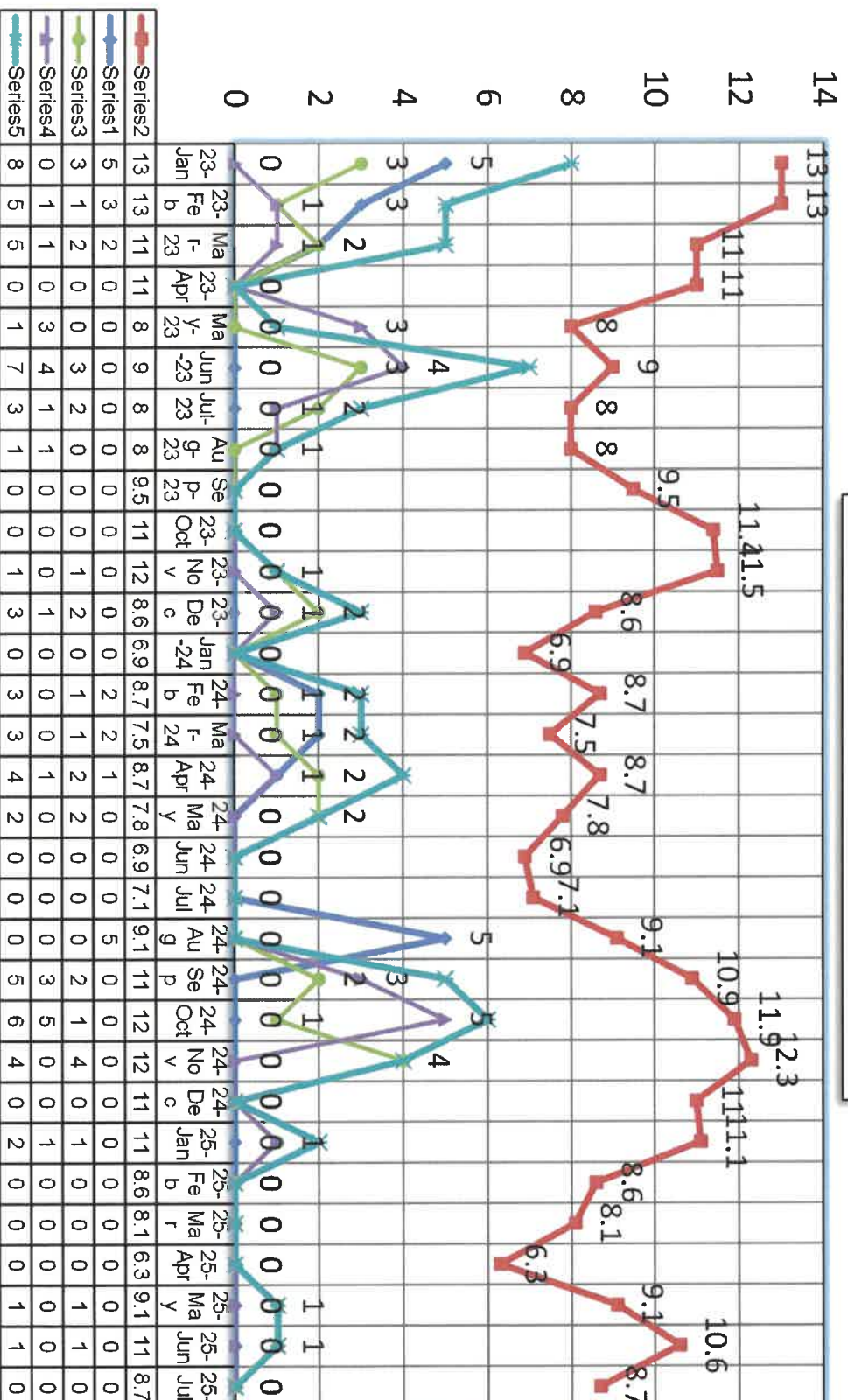
Santa Cruz County Juvenile Hall Room Confinement Over 4 Hours January 2024 - July 2025


