Healthy Pets for All Clinics Available Friday

Free pop-up pet vaccination clinics for qualified household available

The Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter has seen several cases recently of parvovirus and distemper in puppies and dogs that have come into the shelter, as well as some cases of severe respiratory infections in cats. Unfortunately, due to a shortage of veterinary professionals nationwide, it has become more difficult and expensive for pet owners to get animals in for regular preventative care in the last few years. For some pet owners, veterinary care is simply out of reach.

To help, the Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter will offer free vaccination clinics for those with fixed or limited incomes at several locations throughout the rest of the year. Upcoming clinics will be held:

At Healthy Pets for All (HPfA) pop-up clinics, registered Veterinary Technicians, assisted by shelter staff and volunteers, will provide core vaccinations, dewormer, and flea and tick prevention to dogs and cats at clinic sites around Santa Cruz County. Some free pet care items and food will also be available, depending upon available donations and funding.

The Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter provides lifesaving and life-enhancing services to pets and their people on a regular basis – in the last year, the Animal Shelter helped hundreds of very low-income people get their pets vaccinated and spayed or neutered, and it regularly provide safe keeping care for pets when owners are hospitalized or incarcerated.

Healthy Pets for All vaccination clinics help prevent the spread of dangerous diseases in the community and is a resource for people who may benefit from referrals and information, as well as core vaccines and preventative care for their beloved pets.

For many people going through hard times - whether that's losing a job or home, battling illness, or struggling with housing, a pet's love and good health can become even more important for mental health and feelings of stability. Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter is committed to keeping people with their beloved pets while ensuring that pets stay healthy and happy.
